Nicole Archambeau is a social and cultural historian of health and healing at Colorado State University. Her research focuses on the intersection of medicine, healing, and Christianity in the western Mediterranean. She places the sufferer at the center of her research questions, searching for evidence of the ways sufferers understood, articulated, and tried to solve health problems. Her first book, titled Souls under Siege: Surviving Plague, War, and Confession in Fourteenth-Century Provence, is under contract with Cornell University Press. It explores sufferers' experiences during the Hundred Years War and the first waves of plague.
