Dr. Emanuel Buttigieg

Emanuel Buttigieg is a Senior Lecturer in early modern history at the University of Malta. He graduated B.A. (Hons.) First Class at the University of Malta in 2002. During 2003-2004 he was engaged as a Principal Officer at the Office of the Prime Minister of Malta. In 2004 he was awarded a Commonwealth (Cambridge) Scholarship to read for an M.Phil. in early modern history at the University of Cambridge (Peterhouse); he wrote a dissertation about childhood history in early modern Malta. In 2005, he was awarded further scholarships in order to be able to pursue his studies at doctoral level. His Ph.D. dealt with nobility, faith and masculinity in the Order of Malta in the seventeenth century. His doctoral supervisor was Prof Mary Laven (Jesus College). His first book was entitled *Nobility, Faith and Masculinity: The Hospitaller Knights of Malta, c.1580-c.1700* (London and New York: Continuum, 2011). Together with Dr Simon Phillips, of the University of Cyprus, he has co-edited *Islands and Military Orders, c.1291-c.1798* (Farnham: Ashgate, 2013). He is also the author of several papers in journals and edited books, as well as having edited a number of works. At present he is Vice-President *ex-officio* of the Malta University Historical Society (MUHS) and he was a Committee member of the Malta Historical Society (MHS) between 2011 and 2015.
