Dr. Samuel Cohen is an Associate Professor in the Department of History, California State University, Sonoma. His research focuses on social and religious conflict and its relationship to community formation and the construction of authority in late antique Italy and the Mediterranean more broadly. He is particularly interested in how rhetoric was mobilized to construct and contest meaning in polemical texts. Dr. Cohen has published widely on these and related subjects, including recent articles in *Early Medieval Europe*, the Journal of Early Christian Studies, Entangled Religions, the Journal of Late Antiquity, and forthcoming articles in Late Antique Archaeology, Hagiotheca, Jahrbuch für Antike und Christentum, and Studies in Late Antiquity. His recent work focuses on social conflict at Rome, its causes, and its consequences.
