Dr. Gwyn Davies is an Associate Professor in the Department of History at Florida International University and obtained his Ph.D. on Roman Siege Works from the UCL Institute of Archaeology. He specializes in Roman military archaeology and is particularly interested in the mechanisms of imperial security in upland/desert areas that did not undergo conventional, urban-oriented processes of assimilation. Superpower interactions in the ancient world and the role of fortifications in the strategic calculation of imperial actors are also of interest to him. Dr Davies teaches a range of undergraduate and graduate classes in both the classical world and comparative military history. Some of his seminars include: "Warfare in the Ancient World', "Conflict on the Imperial Periphery", "Warfare in the Long 19th Century" and "Archaeology for Historians". He has conducted fieldwork in Albania, Britain, France, Israel, Italy, Jordan, Spain and Turkey and has directed several archaeological projects in Israel.
