Andrew Devereux, Associate Professor in the Department of History at UC-San Diego, is an historian of the medieval and early modern Mediterranean. He is the author of *The Other Side of Empire: Just War in the Mediterranean and the Rise of Early Modern Spain* (Cornell University Press, 2020). He has published articles in the *Journal of Spanish Cultural Studies*, *Pedralbes*, *Republics of Letters*, and *Medieval Encounters*, and has contributed book chapters to edited collections. Devereux's work has been recognized with grants from the John W. Kluge Center, the Folger Institute, the IIE-Fulbright, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the Spanish Ministry of Culture and Education. He is a founding member of the Spain-North Africa Project and currently serves as the organization's President. He serves on the Advisory Board to the Mediterranean Seminar, and is the Editor of *The Mediterranean Seminar Review*. At UCSD, he teaches undergraduate and graduate classes on medieval and early modern Mediterranean history, environmental history, and global history in the early modern era.
