

Andrew Devereux, Associate Professor in the Department of History at UC-San Diego, is an historian of the medieval and early modern Mediterranean. His first book, *The Other Side of Empire: Just War in the Mediterranean and the Rise of Early Modern Spain* (Cornell University Press, 2020), examines imperial ideology and legal arguments pertaining to war and conquest in the fifteenth- and sixteenth-century Mediterranean. He is a founding member of the Spain-North Africa Project and currently serves as the organization's President. He serves on the Advisory Board to the Mediterranean Seminar, and is the Editor of *The Mediterranean Seminar Review*. At UCSD, he teaches undergraduate and graduate classes on medieval and early modern Mediterranean history, environmental history, and global history in the early modern era.
