William Granara is Research Professor of Arabic at Harvard University. He specializes in the literature and history of the Arab Mediterranean in both the medieval and modern periods. He is author of Narrating Muslim Sicily: War and Peace in the Medieval Mediterranean World (2019) and Ibn Hamdis the Sicilian: Eulogist for a Falling Homeland (2021). He is also co-editor of The Thousand and One Nights: Sources and Transformations in Literature, Art, and Science (2020). In addition, he has published translations of several Arabic novels into English: Tahar Wattar's Earthquake; Radwa Ashour's Granada; and Jurji Zaydan's Battle of Poitiers. He is currently working on a monograph on the life and work of Zin al-'Abdin al-Sanusi (d. 1965), a monumental figure in both the nationalist movement and its concurrent Arabic Nahda in the first half of the 20th century Tunisia.
