Mayte Green-Mercado is Assistant Professor of History at Rutgers University-Newark. Her first book, *Visions of Deliverance. Moriscos and the Politics of Prophecy in the Early Modern Mediterranean,* examined the political culture of Moriscos—Spanish Muslims who were forcibly converted to Catholicism beginning in 1501—through their deployment of prophecies about the End Times. She also edited a volume for the Journal of the Social and Economic History of the Orient titled "Speaking the End Times: Prophecy and Messianism in Early Modern Eurasia," *JESHO*— *Journal of the Economic and Social History of the Orient* 61 (2018): 18-90. Her current book project, *Mediterranean Displacements. Morisco Migrations in the Sixteenth Century* traces the history of migrations and displacement of Moriscos around the Mediterranean basin, from their forced conversion to Catholicism until their expulsion from the Iberian Peninsula in 1609.
