Manuel Herrero-Sánchez is Professor of Early Modern History at Pablo de Olavide University in Seville. He received his PhD from the European University Institute in Florence in 1998. He is a historian of the Spanish Monarchy, merchant republics, and commercial networks in the early modern period. He is the author of 3 monographs and has edited 9 books. He is currently working on his monograph The Hispanic Monarchy: A polycentric imperial structure of urban republics to be published in 2022 by Routledge in the series "Early Modern Iberian History in Global Contexts." He has taught as a research fellow at the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (Paris), the Istituto Benedetto Croce of Naples, the Center for the History of European Expansion (IGEER) in Leiden University, and at the Institute of History (CSIC) in Madrid. He was a Visiting Scholar in 2015 at the Department of History in Harvard University; Senior Research Fellow at the Leibniz-Institut für Europäische Geschichte (IEG) in Mainz, and Visiting Scholar in 2017 in École Normale Supérieure de Lyon. He is currently the PI of the research project REXPUBLICA, A Monarchical Res Publica: The Spanish Monarchy, A Polycentric Imperial Structure of Urban Republics (Spanish Ministry of Science, 2019-2022), coordinating the research work of 27 European and American researchers. He is also a corresponding Academician of the Real Academia de la Historia and member of the Academia Europaea.
