

Sharon Kinoshita is Professor of Literature at the University of California, Santa Cruz, specializing in medieval French literature, Mediterranean Studies, and the Global Middle Ages. Among her publications are *Medieval Boundaries: Rethinking Difference in Old French Literature* (2006), co-authored books on Chrétien de Troyes (2011) and Marie de France (2012), and two co-edited volumes: the Wiley-Blackwell *Companion to Mediterranean History* (with Peregrine Horden, 2014) and *Can We Talk Mediterranean?* (with Brian Catlos, 2017). She has translated Marco Polo's *Description of the World* (2016) and is currently completing a volume on Marco Polo for the Reaktion Press series Medieval Lives.
