

Toby Yuen-Gen Liang is an associate research fellow at the Institute of History and Philology at Academia Sinica, Taiwan's national academy of sciences. He was previously associate professor at National Taiwan University and Wheaton College, Massachusetts. Liang specializes on Spanish-Mediterranean history and currently researches northern Africa as a subject in European visual culture from the fifteenth to eighteenth centuries. He is the author of *Family and Empire: The Fernández de Córdoba and the Spanish Realm* (University of Pennsylvania Press) and the co-editor of three collections of essays (Routledge and Brill). His articles have appeared in American, Dutch, Spanish, Italian, and South Korean publications in English, Chinese, and Korean. Liang is the founder of the Spain-North Africa Project and co-founder of the Wheaton Institute of the Interdisciplinary Humanities. He is on the founding boards of the Asian Federation of Mediterranean Studies Institutes and *The Medieval Globe* journal. Liang's work has been funded by Taiwan's National Science Council/Ministry of Science and Technology, the United States' Fulbright Foundation, National Endowment for the Humanities, and Social Science Research Council, and Spain's Ministry of Culture. In 2023, Liang will be in residence at the John Carter Brown Library and the Newberry Library. He earned his Ph.D. at Princeton University.
