Suzanne Magnanini is Associate Professor and President's Teaching Scholar in the Department of French and Italian. Her research explores the porous borders between early modern Italian fairy tales, science, law, and the *querelle des femmes*. She is the author of *Fairy Tale Science: Monstrous Generation in the Fairy Tales of Straparola and Basile* (Toronto 2008) and the editor and translator of Straparola's tale collection *The Pleasant Nights* (2015) in the Other Voice in Early Modern Europe Series. She is currently working on three projects: editing a volume titled *The Cultural History of the Fairy Tale During the Age of the Marvelous (1450-1650)*, editing another volume titled *Representing Slavery in Early Modern Italian Literature* with Armando Maggi, and writing a monograph tentatively titled *Censorship and the Fairy Tale in Post-Tridentine Italy.*
