Dr. Andrea Pauw (andrea.pauw@cnu.edu) is an Assistant Professor of Spanish at Christopher Newport University. A scholar of early modern Iberian literatures and cultures, she specializes in aljamiado (Spanish transliterated with the Arabic alphabet) manuscripts produced by mudéjares (Muslims living under Christian rule in medieval Iberia) and moriscos (Muslims forcibly converted to Christianity in the sixteenth century). Her research has been published in the Hispanic Review, in Routledge's Companion to Medieval Iberia: Unity in Diversity, and forthcoming in La Corónica. Her current book project examines representations of moriscos in nineteenth-century historiography, visual art, and the press, arguing that the confluence of interest in the moriscos' past and discoveries of aljamiado manuscripts profoundly shaped the emergence of the modern Spanish nation-state.
