

Bianca Premo is Professor of Latin American History and Interim Chair of the History Department at FIU. Her scholarship centers on the Spanish empire, especially Peru and Mexico. She has published on the history of childhood and legal history, with special attention to indigenous, women and enslaved litigants. Her most recent monograph is entitled *The Enlightenment on Trial* (Oxford 2017), and she has published recent articles on Southern Mexican jurisdiction, the viceregal court of Mex City, and the politics of age in the Spanish empire in the *American Historical Review* and the *Law and History Review*. Her current research on the history of child mothers in the 20<sup>th</sup> century Peru has been supported by several grants including a John Simon Guggenheim Fellowship.
