Isidro Rivera holds a PhD in Comparative Literature from the University of Illinois and teaches medieval Iberian studies at the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at the University of Kansas, Lawrence. He is also a core faculty member of the Medieval and Early Modern Program and an affiliated faculty member of the Early Modern Seminar at the Hall Center, Lawrence. His research focuses on late medieval Iberian literary production in the court of Isabel de Castilla. He has edited with Donna Rogers the Historia de doncella Teodor. A critical edition of the 1489 Historia de la linda Melosina is nearing completion. Currently he is preparing a study of the intersection of print culture and devotional reading during the reign of Isabel and Fernando. His publications have appeared in various journals including the *Journal of Hispanic Philology*, *Modern Language Notes*, Celestinesca, Revista Hispánica Moderna, Essays in Medieval Studies, University of Toronto Quarterly, and Hispanic Review. Isidro is the Managing Editor of La corónica: A Journal of Medieval Spanish Language, Literature, and Cultural Studies, serves on the Editorial Board of The Medieval and Early Modern Iberian World, and is the Editor-in-Chief of the Companions to Medieval Literatures and Cultures series at Brill.
