

Joëlle Rollo-Koster is Professor of Medieval History at the University of Rhode Island. A scholar of the Avignon papacy, she is the author of *Raiding Saint Peter* (2008), *The People of Curial Avignon: A Critical Edition of the Liber Divisionis and the Matriculae of Notre Dame la Majour* (2009), *Avignon and Its Papacy, 1309–1417: Popes, Institutions, and Society* (2015), and *The Great Western Schism, 1378-1417: Performing Legitimacy, Performing Unity* (2022). She has edited a few other volumes, her most recent being *Death in Medieval Europe: Death Scripted and Death Choreographed* (2016) and the forthcoming *The Cambridge History of the Papacy* (3 volumes, CUP, 2024-2025). In 2016, she was made Chevalier de l'Ordre des Palmes Académiques. She teaches a wide variety of courses at the University of Rhode Island, ranging from a popular freshmen medieval survey to graduate courses on the history of the Mediterranean and historical anthropology.
