Zrinka Stahuljak is Director of the CMRS Center for Early Global Studies and Professor of Comparative Literature and French at UCLA. She is author of five monographs, co-author of two books, and co-editor of two volumes, in addition to more than thirty research articles, public humanities essays, and translations. Her work has been recognized, among others, with a visiting professorship at the Collège de France (2018), and fellowships from the Guggenheim (2016), Fulbright (2013), and the IAS Princeton (2005-06). Among her recent books are *Les Fixeurs au Moyen Âge: Histoire et littérature connectées* (2021; Croatian trans. 2023), *Médiéval contemporain: Pour une littérature connectée* (2020), *Pornographic Archaeology: Medicine, Medievalism, and the Invention of the French Nation* (2013; French trans. 2018), and she has just completed *Fixers: Agency, Translation, and the Early Global History of Literature* (forthcoming UP Chicago, January 2024).
