

Noam Sienna is a scholar of Jewish culture and history, focusing especially on the medieval and early modern periods, with a particular interest in Jewish communities in the Islamic world. He completed his PhD at the University of Minnesota in 2020, and is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor in Religion at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. His first monograph, tentatively titled *Jewish Book Culture in Early Modern North Africa*, is forthcoming. He is also the editor of *A Rainbow Thread: An Anthology of Queer Jewish Texts from the First Century to 1969* (Print-O-Craft Press, 2019), which received the 2020 Reference Award from the Association of Jewish Libraries and the 2020 Anthology Award from the Lambda Literary Foundation.
