Travis Bruce is Assistant Professor of medieval history at McGill University. His dissertation at the Universities of Toulouse and Western Michigan examined the taifa of Denia and the communication networks of the eleventh-century Mediterranean. He is completing a book manuscript based on this that uses the specific example of Denia to reconsider how we think about the Mediterranean through the lenses of violence, identity, and space. He has received grants from the (Canadian) Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council and the Quebec Research Program for New Academics (FRQSC) for his newer work on commercial mediation and translation in the Medieval Western Mediterranean). His most recent article from this project, "Dragomans and the Cultivation and Use of Trust in Thirteenth-Century Mediterranean Commerce", was published earlier this year in the *Journal of Medieval Worlds*. His newest project examines the relationship between unfreedom and spiritual capital.
