

Joshua M. White is Associate Professor of History at the University of Virginia. He is the author of *Piracy and Law in the Ottoman Mediterranean* (Stanford University Press, 2017). A specialist in the social, legal, and diplomatic history of the early modern Ottoman Empire and Mediterranean world, he is currently working on two major book projects. *Of Free Origin: Slavery and Freedom Suits in the Ottoman Empire* is the first in-depth study of the persistent, empire-wide trafficking of illegally enslaved Ottoman subjects and their struggles to win release through Ottoman courts from the sixteenth to nineteenth centuries; *An Epic Tale of Sorrow and Joy: Slavery, Migration, and the Mediterranean Journeys of an Ottoman Manuscript* is an interdisciplinary microhistory of a fictional Ottoman Turkish tale of Mediterranean captivity and the sole manuscript in which it survives. He is also preparing a series of articles under the theme “Ottoman Malta,” exploring the continuous Ottoman presence on and engagement with the island throughout the centuries of Hospitaller rule.
