

Shai Zamir is a PhD history candidate at the University of Michigan. He works on the early modern Iberian world and on early modern Jewish history, especially of the western Sephardi diaspora and on Jewish-Christian polemics. He holds a master's degree from Tel Aviv University, and won different fellowships, including from the American Historical Association, Casa de Velázquez in Madrid, and the John Carter Brown Library in Providence. This year he is a fellow at the Center for Jewish History in New York and will defend his dissertation, on the cultural history of friendship in the seventeenth century Iberian world.
