Harry Eli Kashdan is Postdoctoral Scholar in the Global Mediterranean at The Ohio State University. After completing his Ph.D. in Comparative Literature at the University of Michigan in 2018, he was Lauro de Bosis Postdoctoral Fellow in Italian at Harvard before joining the department of French and Italian at OSU. His research addresses the importance of food to narratives of migration in the contemporary Mediterranean, drawing on sources in Italian, Arabic, French, English, and Judeo-Spanish. He has published articles on the literary qualities of cookbooks in *Food & Foodways* and *Mashriq & Mahjar*, and has pieces forthcoming in *Quest* and *Italian Culture*.
