

Jessica Weiss is Associate Professor of Art History, Theory and Criticism at Metropolitan State University of Denver. Her research focuses on the artistic connections between Iberia and Northern Europe in the fifteenth-century, specifically the reception of Netherlandish objects and Hispano-Flemish painting, and the ways in which visual culture was used to articulate a proto-nationalistic "Spanish" identity. She is especially interested on the patronage projects sponsored by Isabel of Castile and her court, as well as their continued use and display by subsequent elites. Publications include "The Economics of Aesthetics and the Financial Success of the Isabelline Artist Juan de Flandes" in the *Journal of Historians of Netherlandish Art* (2018), "Relics of Los Reyes Católicos: Spanish Habsburg Family Heirlooms and Dynastic Identity" in *Imagery and Ingenuity in Early Modern Europe* (Brepols, 2018), and "Art Commissioned and Collected by Queen Isabel" in the *Companion to Isabel la Católica* (Brill, forthcoming).
