Biographical Note

Joana is a History PhD student at the University of Washington and a fellow at the Stroum Center of Jewish Studies, working with Prof. Devin Naar. Following a BSc in Psychology at Potsdam University in Germany (2013-2017), she completed an International Research MA in Middle Eastern History at Tel Aviv University in Israel (2017-2020). Her MA thesis, entitled “Early Zionist Contribution to the Making of Greek Jewry: Case Study of Moisis Caimis’ *Israilitiki Epitheorisis* (1912-1916), focused on Greco-Jewish identity formation in early 20th century Corfu and Athens. She became familiar with digital approaches to Holocaust remembrance while working as a translator for the oral history project “Memories of the German Occupation in Greece,” realized by Freie Universität Berlin and the National Kapodistrias University of Athens (2018). Her research interests are modern Mediterranean Jewish history, migrations in the Eastern Mediterranean in the interwar period and comparative Holocaust memory.
