

Fabien Montcher is Assistant Professor of History at Saint Louis University. He works on the early modern social history of knowledge and politics with a special but not exclusive emphasis on Iberian worlds. His book entitled *Mercenaries of Knowledge* came out last Fall with Cambridge University Press.

This year, Fabien is writing a new monograph on the political history of citrus fruits across early modern Iberian worlds while in residence at the Newberry Library in Chicago.

At the margins of projects dedicated to exploring the overlapping histories of bibliopolitics, biopolitics, rhizomes, and empires, Fabien co-directed last summer an NEH Institute on *Global Geographies of Knowledge*. He is the Director of the new Center for Iberian Studies (CIHS) at St. Louis University.

His research has been supported by the UCLA Clark Library, the Huntington Library, the ACLS, the NEH, the Spanish Ministry of Culture, the FLAD Foundation in Lisbon, the Newberry Library, and the Institute for Advanced Studies at Princeton.
