Juanma García-Fernández is a PhD student at the University of Colorado Boulder. He earned his BA in Modern Languages from the University of Granada. He also holds an MA in Teaching Spanish as a Second Language from the University of Salamanca and a second MA in Spanish and Latin American Literature from the University of Colorado Boulder. For his doctoral studies, he specializes in early twentieth-century Spanish literature, especially in the works of Catholic writers.
