Khadija Harsolia currently teaches Spanish language and literature at Soka University of America in Alisó Viejo, California. She first learnt of Aljamiado as an undergraduate student studying International studies at DePaul University when Spanish professor Dr. Juana Goergen casually mentioned it in conversation. Intrigued, she would have her first formally encounter the Mudejars and Moriscos while pursuing a Masters in Latin American studies at the University of Chicago in a class called Christians, Muslims and Jews in Medieval Spain taught by Dr. Lucy Pick. Her first real encounter with Aljamiado though would come later when she was invited to audit a course on Aljamiado at Stanford University taught by Vincent Barletta. Most recently she completed her doctoral studies in Spanish at the University of California, Riverside with advisor Dr. Benjamin Liu. Her dissertation is titled "Captivity, Confinement, and Resistance in Mudéjar and Morisco Literature" in which she considers not only writings by Mudéjar and Morisco authors in Aljamiado but also works about characters occurring in the traditional Spanish canon.
