Núria Silleras-Fernández is an Associate Professor at the Department of Spanish and Portuguese of Spanish at the University of Colorado-Boulder, with affiliations in Humanities, History, and Women and Gender Studies. Her research focuses on cultural and intellectual history, gender, and literature in Medieval and Early Modern Iberia, Europe, and the Mediterranean. She is the author of three scholarly monographs, *Power, Piety, and Patronage in Late Medieval Queenship: Maria de Luna* (Palgrave: 2008 and in Spanish CSIC: 2012); *Chariots of Ladies: Francesc Eiximenis and the Court Culture of Medieval and Early Modern Iberia* (Cornell UP: 2015), and *The Politics of Emotion: Love, Grief, and Madness in Medieval and Early Modern Iberia* (Cornell UP: 2024). She has also coedited *In and Of the Mediterranean. Medieval and Early Modern Iberian Studies* (Vanderbilt UP: 2015); *Teaching Gender Through Latin American, Latino, and Iberian Texts and Cultures* (Sense Publishing: 2015), and *Iberian Babel: Translation and Multilingualism in the Medieval and Early Modern Mediterranean* (Brill: 2022). She is currently working on two book projects; one relates to gender, sexuality, and emotions, and the other one to cultural capitals, exchange, polyglossia, patronage, translation, and gender.
