Nükhet Varlık is Associate Professor of History at <u>Rutgers University-Newark</u>. She is a historian of the Ottoman Empire interested in disease, medicine, and public health. She is the author of award-winning <u>Plague and Empire in the Early Modern Mediterranean World: The Ottoman Experience, 1347–1600</u> (2015) and editor of <u>Plague and Contagion in the Islamic Mediterranean</u> (2017). She is currently working on new book projects addressing different aspects of death and disease in Ottoman society. In conjunction with this research, she is involved in developing the <u>Black Death Digital Archive</u>, collecting and editing a number of sources pertaining to the history of plague in the Islamicate world, and contributing to multidisciplinary research projects that incorporate perspectives from palaeogenetics (ancient DNA research in particular), bioarchaeology, disease ecology, and climate science into historical inquiry. She is the co-editor of <u>Stanford Ottoman World Series: Critical Studies in Empire</u>, Nature, and Knowledge.
