Yosi Yisraeli is a lecturer at the Israel and Golda Koschitzky Department of Jewish History and Contemporary Jewry at Bar-Ilan University, since 2021. He is an historian of Jewish and Christian thought in the late Middle Ages and Early Modern Period. His areas of specialization include the phenomena of religious conversion, Jewish-Christian dialogue, converso theology, biblical studies, apologetics, and Christian Hebraism. He received his Ph.D. from Tel Aviv University in 2015 and has been fellow at the Mandel Scholion Research Center in the Humanities and Jewish Studies at the Hebrew University and at the Center for Jewish Studies at Harvard University. He published several studies on the theology of the convert Bishop from Burgos, Pablo de Santa María (c.1352-1435). Among his forthcoming articles are) "Defining 'Conversos' in Fifteenth Century Castile: The Making of a Controversial Category" (co-authored with dr. Yanay Israeli), which is due in the coming issue of Speculum, and "The Maimonidean Heritage of a Conversionist Ideology: Abner of Burgos on Traditions, Esotericism and Crisis" in the coming issue of Te'uda.
